Founded in 1968, Federally Employed Women (FEW) is a professional organization that works for the betterment of women in the Federal government. FEW has its headquarters in Washington, D.C. FEW works toward ending sex discrimination and sexual harassment in government service, increasing job opportunities for women and minorities, improving the merit system in government, and establishing and maintaining working relationships with Federal agencies to advocate the fair application of EEO and personnel laws, policies, practices and procedures.

FEW Today

FEW is organized on national, regional and chapter levels. Activities, programs, and functions related to the organization's goals and objectives take place at all levels. FEW is a private, nonprofit, nonpartisan grassroots membership organization that seeks to:

- eliminate sex discrimination in the Federal government
- enhance opportunities for career advancement of women
- establish and maintain positive relationships with Federal agencies
- advocate the fair application of EEO and personnel laws and policies
- improve the quality of life for women by influencing Congressional and administrative actions
- work continually to achieve a unified, diverse membership that values and capitalizes on similarities and differences at all levels of the organization

Because FEW is a private organization, it is less restricted in its efforts as a constructive advocacy group to improve the status of women employed by the Federal Government. Activities include contacts with members of Congress to support the status of important legislation and meeting with Agency officials in support of the Federal Women's Program and to stress its importance to the fight against sex discrimination.
